Payment for Placements was started at the University of Michigan Ann Arbor by MSW students Matt Dargay and Arie Davey in the Fall of 2021. Since its inception, Payment for Placements has grown into a national movement. Today, the initiative has chapters across the country.

Payment for Placements at the University of Michigan has been featured in The Michigan Daily and The Detroit News, and Deadline Detroit. Payment for Placements at San Diego State University has been featured in the San Diego Union-Tribune.
