## Expectations of ACOSA Board Members & Geographic Definition of ACOSA's Regions

The Board of ACOSA includes one member elected to represent and support members in the following regions:

- (1) **NORTHEAST**: Connecticut, Maine, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, New York; Rhode Island, Vermont;
- (2) **MID-ATLANTIC:** Delaware, Maryland, New Jersey, Pennsylvania, West Virginia, Virginia, District of Columbia;
- (3) **SOUTHEAST**: North Carolina, South Carolina, Georgia, Florida, Kentucky, Tennessee, Alabama, Mississippi, Puerto Rico, and the U.S. Virgin Islands;
- (4) **NORTH CENTRAL:** Iowa, Illinois, Minnesota, Nebraska, South Dakota, North Dakota, Wisconsin, Michigan, Ohio, Indiana;
- (5) **SOUTH CENTRAL**: Arkansas, Louisiana, Missouri, Kansas, Oklahoma, Texas;
- (6) NORTHWEST: Washington, Oregon, Idaho, Montana, Wyoming, Alaska;
- (7) **SOUTHWEST**: Arizona, Colorado, Utah, New Mexico, Nevada, California, Hawaii, American Samoa, Guam, and the Northern Mariana Islands;
- (8) **AT-LARGE**: elected at-large from any region inside or outside the United States and its territories.

## **Brief Description of Board Member Responsibilities**

- 1. Guide the direction of the organization by attending and participating in Board meetings (minimum of 4/year).
- 2. Support the purposes and mission of ACOSA by planning, participating in, and developing organizational activities and resources.
- 3. Regional representatives focus on outreach, recruitment, engagement, and member connection activities in their region.
- 4. The At-large representative is responsible for outreach, recruitment, engagement, and leadership development and member connection activities for the region or constituency they represent.
- 5. Convener representatives are responsible for the following: 1) participate in the annual work plan development meeting; 2) convene meetings/communications as necessary to implement annual work plan activities; 3) recruit/orient new members to the committee, work group, resource or activity; and 4) submit a brief update on activities prior to each scheduled Board meeting.
